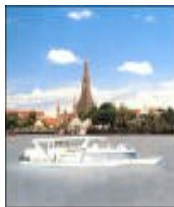

**B1 Grand Palace & Wat Phra Kaew (900 Baht)** See the Grand Palace in the historic Rattanakosin area of Bangkok, next to the Chao Phraya river. It's quite stunning! The architecture is a great mix of Thai and European styles, and if you can only see one sight in Bangkok, this should be it. The lovely Temple of the Emerald Buddha is in the same complex. 8:30 - 11:30 or 13:00 -16:30 pick up from and to hotel with



**B2 Golden Buddha & Reclining Buddha (900 Baht)** Wat Trimitr, the temple of the Golden Buddha - the statue of Buddha is made from solid gold weighting 5.5 tons; Wat Po, the temple of the Reclining Buddha-the largest and oldest in Bangkok. 8:30-11:30 or 13:00-16:30 pick up from and to hotel with tour guide.



**B3 Chao Phraya Princess Dinner Cruise (950 Baht):** Cruising along the Chao Phraya River you can take a look in the riverlife by night, a truly exotic experience. Dine on a variety of authentic Thai food set menu or international buffet. 18:00 - 21:45 daily. 150 Baht pick up from and to hotel is excluded.

**B4 Siam Niramit "Journey to the Enchanted Kingdom of Siam" (1,200 Baht with pick up)**



Spectacular performance of Thailand's art and cultural heritage. 2,000 seat theatre with huge stage, 120 performers, 100 technicians with special effect. This is a world class spectacular. Show time is on 20:00.



**B5 Thai Boxing : Ring-side seat (2,000 Baht without pick up)**

Thai Boxing, is the national sport of Thailand and is a martial art with origins in the ancient battlefield tactics of the Siamese (or Thai) army. It evolved from Krabi-Krabong, literally sword and baton, the hand-to-hand tactics of the Thai army. Fighting time starts at 18:30 for 7 fights.



**B6 Calypso Cabaret Show (650 Baht)**

See the show that has astonishing sets, dazzling costumes and beautiful show transvestite girls. Show times are 20:15 and 21:45. 150 Baht pick up from and to hotel is excluded.

**B7 “Hun Lakorn Lek” Thai Puppetry at Joe Louis Theater: Thai Traditional Performance on the World Stage. (750 Baht)**

Thai puppetry, or *hun lakhon lek*, proved to be among the best traditional performances in the world as soon as the Joe Louis Theater’s puppet show was pronounced “the best cultural performance”



The 10th Puppet Art Festival was held in Prague, the Czech Republic, with as many as 40 participant countries around the world. Joining in the competition, the 30-member Joe Louis troupe presented its 50-minute performance titled "The Myth of Rahu and the Lunar Eclipse," which has been showcased at the Joe Louis Theater. The show tells the story of Thailand’s ancient belief that a lunar eclipse is caused by a demon who swallows the moon.

According to the Thai ambassador to Prague, this was the first time Thailand has sent a puppet performance to join the World Puppet Art Festival, and the Joe Louis Theater was among 42 from 230 troupes selected for the festival. And, as the winner of this year’s competition, the troupe was also invited to give the curtain-raising performance at next year’s festival.

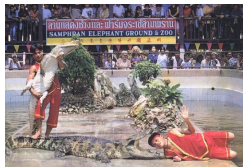


The 21-year-old Joe Louis troupe noted that the way Thai puppeteers control their puppets makes the country’s performance unique among the various forms of puppetry in the world. Each puppet is manipulated by three puppeteers who also appear on stage and perform *khon*, (a Thai classical dance), along with the puppet to create a lifelike movement. With this traditional puppetry show, the audience will not only be provided with graceful performance, but also learn Thailand’s culture and way of life.



**w1 Floating Market and Crocodile Farm with elephant show(1,500 Baht with lunch,tour guide):**

This real floating market is situated in Ratchaburi Province, 110 km from Bangkok. Ride on a boat rowing along the canals with the other boat rowers selling exotic tropical fruits. The greatest elephant show in Thailand, enjoy the



football jumbo cub, dancing and re-enacting yutha hathi, and an ancient battle scene on elephant back. See men wrestling with crocodiles in one of the largest crocodile farm in the world. For the first time ever. an elephant show complete with dramatic sound and narration. Be entertain to a host of shows and demonstrations of elephant at work and at play. See for yourself how elephants are

rounded up and used during battles in ancient Siam amidst a historical background. A most memorable entertainment will be the mockup battle of the mighty war between King Naraesuan the Great and the Burmese prince where elephants were used by both armies. 06:30–17:00 pick up from and to hotel with tour guide.



**E1 Pattaya one day tour, sight seeing around Nongnuch tropical garden (1,600 Baht with lunch):**

See the largest variety of orchids in Thailand. More than 670 native species and hybrids are kept here for breeding and research purposes. Having lunch and see Thai cultural shows, then visit Pattaya Beach to have sun - baht , swimming, Thai traditional massage and take shower. 8:00 – 18:00 pick up from

and to hotel.



**N1 Ayutthaya Ancient City with Cruise Lunch (1,600 Baht with pick up and tour guide on board)**

Ayutthaya used to be a flourishing and prosperous capital in the past. It was the capital for 417 years, and during this long period there arose a great deal of construction, among them were numerous palaces and temples. As more than 30 monarches ruled over Ayutthaya, innumerable events occurred, some of which were historically recorded, still narrated nowadays. 06:00 – 16:30 daily pick up from and to hotel with tour guide on board.
